times they tried to help the situation. This is a statewide issue, it is something with the mixture of emulsion. It is still being investigated, and they will continue to monitor it and respond accordingly.

TOWNSHIP ENGINEER

NCCD Complaint 2025-03-3228 W. Scenic Drive.

There were extensive waivers granted to this property, there was a covenant added to this plan for no disturbance. Which the owners have gone against and could result in it being retracted. Topsoil was

stripped and some areas raised about 2-4'. The owner Anthony Dex was present and discussed why he did the work on his property. It was strictly agricultural purposes, and he did not know that would be included in the waivers/covenant. Mr. Dex is still waiting for NCCD to stop back out and look at the property. Mr. Horvath is unsure of the property layout before work and what exactly he has changed. Attorney Backenstoe stated the plans have not yet been recorded. Mr. Dex needs to have NCCD come back and check the property to have full release on the complaint, Mr. Horvath will then check the property, and the plans will be submitted once cleared. All of this needs to be finished within 6 months, if not, the board should withdraw conditional approval. Mr. Horvath mentioned it would be better for him to go out asap to check the area.

Mr. Shaffer made a motion that the owner of 3228 W. Scenic Drive has 6 months from today's date to have the NCCD violation corrected, if not, the matter should be brought to the board, and they will consider withdrawing the conditional approval.

Maya van Rossum, 800 Copella Road. -Delaware River keeper. Stated her concern with the landscape work that had been done with the waivers that were set in place. Meeting Summary from the discussion with AMS and KCE as well as other treatment options. MS4 basins- estimates for some of the work came in just under \$25K, which is under the threshold for prevailing wages. The scope of work does not include a performance bond nor a maintenance bond which is something usually required. This project will be finished in a few days, just removing trees and planting grass. One application of payment so if the work isn't finished, he won't be paid. Attorney Backenstoe stated, you almost never have a contract without the performance bond. For obvious purposes. The downside is requiring the bond will cost more and take the pricing over the threshold. Mr. Hoffman only has a concern about the grass growing in the basins. It was stated they can add in the contract a certain percentage of grass needs to be grown before payment is issued.

Diane Zweifel- Speed Bump Request, Fairway Lane

Concerned with the speeding on Fairway Lane and Keeler Road. She would like speed humps placed in the area. Chief West stated the speed trailer had been placed out there but for only a few days, it was not reading the number of cars and their speed properly. This is the first complaint that has been brought forth since the development was built. Additional 25 MPH signs have been placed at this location. Chief West stated there is another device the PD has that will be placed in the area to record data, as well as borrowing KCEs device to place across the road and have the extra data. Mr. Tavianni was also present and voiced his opinion on having the spend humps placed in the area, he feels there is no issue and there are no speed bumps anywhere else in the township.

Brian Radcliffe- Hometown Heros

622 Monocacy. He is here on behalf of the American Legion of Bath; he would like to include Moore Township and Chapman in the Hometown Hero program. Banners would be 30"x50", it is not a fundraiser and the fee is \$180. It is only for recognition for the service members; the fee covers the banner. He would like permission to do so and what roads they would like to include. PPL needs to give permission to do the project, and he is requesting that PW will assist in hanging the banners. There is roughly a two-week turnaround once the proof is approved. Mr. Shaffer will research with PPL and time wise etc.
