Swing set Replacement

The Rec Commission would like to have the swing set off English Road replaced. The quote from George Ely Associates would be \$15,929.00 for installation of a 10' Swing set. It will feature 3 swing bays, 4 belt seats, 4 toddler seats and a tire swing in its own bay. PW would remove the old swing set.

Lights at McAndless

The MTAA would like to purchase lights for the McAndless field. It was stated that L&I would need to be contacted for a permit, being commercial and the Township is an "Opt Out" municipality. The MTAA would be able to fund the lights and poles but is requesting help with the added funds should they need to go through L&I. The Township also stated becoming an "Opt In" municipality may help as well. It was questioned if the Township would be able to donate money towards the project, it is unclear if that is possible without having to bid on the project. Attorney Backenstoe will look into the options and the BOS will wait until next month at the meeting to learn more about becoming an Opt In municipality, once Mr. Nowroski gathers information for them to discuss the process. Mr. Shaffer requested that the MTAA enter an agreement with Osmos for the light poles, including the football field, to ensure maintenance and inspections will be done in a timely manner.

Mr. Shaffer made a motion to allow MTAA to move forward with the lights on McAndless with the conditions that MTAA will enter in a maintenance agreement with Osmos for all wooden poles at the rec center.
